## **ARB 4x4 ACCESSORIES**

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#### NET PAYLOAD FOR YOUR BASE RACK

The net payload for your BASE Rack is calculated by subtracting the weight of the BASE Rack and the vehicle mounting kit from the vehicle's roof capacity. The table below gives the approximative BASE Rack net payload for fitting kit 17921030 and 17921070, using the vehicles maximum vehicle roof capacity. The vehicle's roof load capacity may vary between models and driving conditions. Refer to vehicle owner's manual for model and condition specific roof load capacities.

#### SHARK FIN ANTENNA and BASE RACK

Years 2014 to 2016's 4Runner Shark Fin Antenna is not compatible with 17921040 and 17921070 BASE Rack fitting kits. The antenna is too tall.

Suitable third party antennas are available on the market. Height should not exceed 2-7/16" (62mm).



#### AIR DEFLECTOR and BASE RACK LIGHT BAR

An air deflector or BASE Rack Light Bar should be fitted beneath the front edge of the BASE Rack. Refer to the table below for the matching kit numbers between Air Deflector or BASE Rack Light Bar and BASE Rack fitting kits.

If fitting the light bar in front of the BASE Rack, an Air Deflector should also be fitted. Refer to the instructions provided with these products for further details.

#### FITTING PROCEDURE



 Carefully remove the plastic roof bar covers from each end of the roof bars by gently prying off, see below.

HINT: Apply a strip of masking tape along roof edge as shown to protect surface when levering off cover



2. Carefully remove the factory bolts, metal brackets and bars.

CAUTION: Undo the bracket bolts concurrently: Don't fully remove only one. You must loosen the first one, then loosen the second one. Then, undo each one in stages, because the nut plate within the vehicle roof can easily be dislodged if one bolt is left tight then torque is applied to it.


NOTE: Keep the bars, factory bolts, brackets and plastic covers in a safe place so that they can be re-fitted if you wish to remove the roof rack at a later date.





3. Clean area where seals will go and then place rubber seals over inserts.


NOTE: A non-acidic sealant may be used under the rubber seal.



- 4. Assemble the 4 x mounting bracket to the vehicle roof.
- 5. Position the mounting bracket as shown with the weld nut facing the centre of the vehicle. Attach each bracket to the roof mounting points using M8 x 30 Socket head screws and M8 Bonded washers. See image.


Tighten screws to specified torque

Torque M8 to 22Nm (16lbft)




 Using a tape measure, measure across the vehicle between the middle of the hole on the outside face of the front and rear set of mounting brackets. Make a note of each measurement.



 Place the BASE Rack face down on a clean flat surface. Provide protection to the top face of the BASE Rack to avoid marking of surfaces




8. Insert 2, M8 x 20 Studs into 4 of the Stud Plates as shown.





 Check the position of the mounting plates (circled in image) on the blade brackets in relation to the channels on the BASE Rack.

17921030 Blade Brackets & 1770020 BASE Rack shown.





 Insert the previously assembled stud plates into the correct BASE Rack channels. Rotate the plates 90 degrees.





11. Flip the blade brackets over so they are upside down and carefully place on top of the BASE Rack. When doing so ensure the M8 studs in the stud plates go through the slots. Then secure the blade brackets to the BASE Rack using M8 flat washers and nyloc nuts.







12. Using the previously recorded measurements, adjust the location of the blade bracket on the BASE Rack.

Ensure the distance between the blade bracket and the edge of the tray is the same on both sides. Fully tighten all M8 nyloc nuts to specified torque.






13. If fitting an air deflector or BASE Rack lightbar it should be fitted to the BASE Rack at this point. Refer to instructions provided with the air deflector or BASE Rack light bar for fitting details. (Light Bar must be mounted in forward position)




NOTE: BASE Rack and vehicle removed for clarity

14. With assistance, carefully place the BASE Rack on the vehicle so the inside of the blade brackets rests on the outside of the mounting brackets. The entire BASE Rack assembly should be clear of the vehicle roof. All mounting holes/slots should align closely.

Note: Place protective material on roof to reduce the risk of accidental damage to vehicle when mounting the BASE Rack to the vehicle.



15. Confirm BASE Rack is correctly aligned to vehicle. If it is not it is recommended to remove the BASE Rack from the vehicle roof and repeat the mounting process from the measurement step #6.



16. Use the M8 Button head Torx screws and M8 Black washers to secure the BASE Rack to the roof mounting brackets. Tighten all screw to the specified torque.
