





WARNING

Refer to your vehicle's owner's manual for maximum towing capacity. **DO NOT** exceed vehicle, tongue or hitch weight ratings - failure to follow vehicle manufacturer's recommendations could result in damage to your vehicle, personal injury or death.

WARNING

Failure to read and follow these instructions could result in separation of the trailer from the truck, causing property damage, loss of towed vehicle, personal injury or death.

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- Trailer brakes are required.
- Do not use any open flame under the truck bed to cut or weld. There is extreme danger of explosion or fire.
- Vehicle must be securely blocked and brakes set before beginning to work underneath the vehicle.
- Do not clamp hitch over any wiring or brake lines.
- Always make sure trailer is loaded slightly tongue heavy. Do not pull a trailer that is lighter on the tongue end.
- Always insure the hitch ball is locked into the hitch prior to towing.

Maintenance/Care

- Periodically clean any dirt/debris from the ball and ball housing and moderately lubricate them with white lithium grease or equivalent grease.

Instruction Notes: The heat shield is trimmed for the hitch installation. Some drilling and trimming is required.

Place all components that are removed on a flat, sturdy surface. All items will be reinstalled unless otherwise noted after the hitch is installed.

The dimensional variations between otherwise identical vehicles can be considerable. While this hitch was designed for easy installation, it may be necessary to modify the hitch slightly to compensate for vehicle manufacturer's tolerances.


NOTICE

- When a bed liner is installed, compensation of the bed liner thickness must be accounted for when measuring the ball location in the box bed.
- When using power drills be aware of the dangers of torque and drill bit length.
- When using a reciprocating saw be aware of objects behind the cutting surface.
- Use a good quality paint to spray cut edges of frame to prevent rusting.
- Be sure to use Loctite® Red on all bolts before tightening. Tighten all bolts according to the torque chart provided.
- The installer must instruct the operator on proper ball installation and locking procedures.
- Dealer or installer be certain the user receives these instruction sheets.
- If the hitch is in an accident, it must be replaced. **DO NOT** use it again! An accident can cause unseen damage and using it again could result in more damage or serious injury. **DO NOT** use the hitch if it is damaged or missing parts.
- When inverting the ball, ensure proper clearance between the ball and the truck's differential and drive line. Failure to do so may result in damage. A plug is included with all Blue Ox Gooseneck Hitches that can be used for covering the socket when the ball is removed.


Important:

Use only genuine factory replacement parts on your hitch. Do **NOT** substitute homemade or non-typical parts. If a bolt is lost or in need of replacement, for your safety and the preservation of your hitch, be sure to use a replacement bolt of the same grade (In most cases it will be Grade 5, please reference the parts list above). Replacement parts may be ordered through your nearest Blue Ox® Dealer or Distributor. Failing to follow and/or altering these installation instructions in either installation or required equipment will void the manufacturer's warranty.

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1. Using the vehicles jack handle tool, remove the spare tire as per vehicles owners manual.



2. On the inside of the bed, measure from the rear (not the tailgate) forward 50-1/4" for a 8' bed or 45" for a 6'-6" bed and mark. Measure between the wheel wells and mark center. Using a 5" hole saw, drill a hole thru the bed.

Note: Using a board while drilling decreases chances of the bit wobbling out of position (left inset). It is also recommended to deburr the hole so the hitch will sit tight against the bed (right inset).




3. Remove the heat shield by cutting between two (2) bed frame rails on the underside of the bed above the axle (as shown by the dotted lines).

4. Slide the cross members in from the side. Push the flat end in just ahead of the rib. Slide the angle in part way, lift up and bend the rib then finish pushing it in, then bend the rib back. Turn so that the holes are on the lower side, facing down and to the back.


Optional: Loosen the bed bolts and lift the bed to clear cross members.



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5. Install the center section, by sliding it in from the backside over the axle then aligning with the hole in the bed. Secure in place.



6. On both sides of the center section, bolt the cross members to the center section with the supplied 1/2" hardware. Do not fully tighten hardware.



7. Install the rear plates onto the driver side and passenger side side plates with the 1/2" carriage bolts and hardware. Do not fully tighten hardware.



8. Install both side plates onto the cross members with the appropriate hardware. Do not fully tighten hardware.

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9. Install the u-bolt around the frame thru the side plate and loosely install the lock nut. Do this on both sides of the vehicle. Do not fully tighten hardware.

Note: Be sure to avoid pinching any wires or lines when installing the bolts.



10. Adjust the rear plate if needed and install the 3/4" bolt thru the frame with the oval bushing and 3/4" hardware on the inside of the frame. Do this on both sides of the vehicle. Do not fully tighten hardware.



11. Check the rotation of the top collar at this time to insure the bed is not rubbing against it and it can rotate freely. If necessary drop the center section and remove any obstructions.




12. Tighten and torque all bolts. First torque the 3/4" bolts. Then torque the outside 1/2" bolts and work in to the 1/2" center section bolts.

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13. Using a 19/32" drill bit, drill the two (2) holes closest to the ball thru the bed. Do this on both sides of the center section.



14. Insert the 1/2"-13 u-bolts thru the holes from the topside. Install a 1/2" flat washer, a spring, another 1/2" flat washer and 1/2"-13 lock nut onto each u-bolt stud. Tighten until the washers are touching the spring without compressing it.

15. Reinstall the spare tire per the vehicles owners manual.

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Installing the Hitch Ball



1. Rotate the locking collar to release the latch pawl.



2. Align the ball with the collar and drop the ball into the hitch. Release the locking collar. Pull up on the ball to insure it is locked into the housing.

Removing the Hitch Ball




1. Rotate the locking collar to release the latch pawl. Pull straight up on the ball to remove from the hitch.

Storing the Hitch Ball



1. Rotate the locking collar to release the latch pawl. Align the ball with the collar and drop the ball into the hitch.



2. Release the locking collar.
